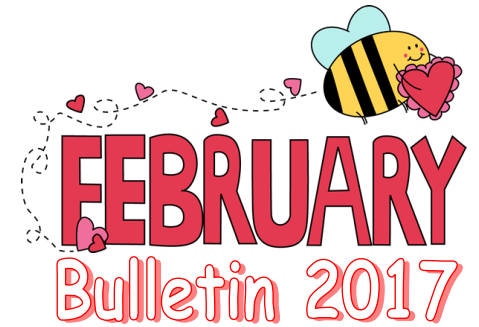


## SHABBAT IN SONG

Among the many holidays observed in February is the one that monitors the actions of *Marmota monax*, more commonly known as the groundhog. According to custom, if a groundhog emerges from its hole on February 2 and does not see its shadow, then we will enjoy an early spring. Small industries have grown up in certain communities that host groundhogs well known for their weather prognostications. And by early February, many of us are eager for the news of warmer temperatures that the rodent might bring.

In 1993, Bill Murray appeared in the Harold Ramis film *Groundhog Day*, which loosely revolves around the traditional holiday. Murray's character Phil Connors finds himself stuck in a time loop. He is forced to continually repeat Groundhog Day until he can "get it right."

In most cases in our life, we are not blessed with this same opportunity (which Phil Connors initially perceives as a curse, but soon comes to appreciate). But Judaism does give us some chances for repeats. The Jewish calendar moves in a very orderly fashion, so that each year we have the opportunity to revisit our favorite holidays, repeating familiar rubrics while constantly innovating and refining. In recent years, Sinai Temple has done just that in numerous ways, such as adding youth worship options for our High Holiday services; joining with Hillel students and community members for our community Passover seder; and holding a food truck rally as part of last year's community celebration of Yom HaAtzma'ut.

Shabbat particularly affords us the opportunity to shake things up a bit. Each year contains about 52 *shabbatot*. And

thought the core rubrics will remain constant, we can modify music, translations, and other factors in order to make each and every Shabbat moving and meaningful.

In his article on the facing page, Gary Bernstein highlights our new First Friday Feasts. These evenings, which combine an early worship service with a delicious dinner and an opportunity to socialize with others in the Sinai community. We have offered a variety of special musical experiences this year, which will include our Shabbat Shira (Sabbath of Song) worship on Friday, February 10; and our guests Jeff Warschauer and Deborah Strauss, whose music we will enjoy on the weekend of February 17 and 18. We have worship opportunities for the entire family during our Next Dor and Shabbat Rocks! Experiences, which take place on the third Friday of every month (and are open to the entire community, whether you have a young one in your family, or are simply "young at heart"). Sinai continues to offer new approaches to appreciating Shabbat, while remaining true to tradition, and to our congregational history.

The rabbis teach that at the onset of Shabbat, we each receive a *neshama y'teira*, an "extra" or "doubled" soul. It stays with us throughout the Sabbath to heighten our enjoyment and appreciation, and departs as we conclude havdalah. In fact, the spices of havdalah are said to act like smelling salts, reviving us as this secondary soul departs from us. But the point is that each Shabbat gives us the opportunity to shift in some way, to embrace a new or revitalized self that enters us through this *neshama y'teira*. Each week, we have the opportunity to "do Shabbat over." But unlike Phil Connors' experience in Punxsatawney, Pennsylvania, our weekly "do over" gives us the chance to renew and refresh ourselves. We are blessed with a chance to commune with the essence of the Divine that is within us, within our neighbors, and present all around us.

I encourage you to explore our many Shabbat offerings. May they bless us all with peace and joy.
