From Rabbí Alan Cook's Desk



MiSheNichnas Adar, Marbim B'Simcha. The rabbis teach us that when the Hebrew month of Adar enters, our happiness increases. Adar is the month in which the festival of Purim occurs, which is traditionally a raucous and silly time, so it is understandable that the sages sought to extend this frivolity to the entire month. This year happens to be a Jewish leap year,

when an additional month of Adar is added to the calendar (it "corrects" the lunar calendar to ensure that Passover remains in the spring, Chanukah remains in the winter, etc.). This means that we are treated to even more of an opportunity to experience joy and happiness.

In the musical "You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown," based on the Peanuts cartoons by Charles M. Schulz, lyricist Clark Gesner concludes the show with a song titled, "Happiness Is." Each of the characters reflects on the simple pleasures in life that bring them satisfaction and delight:

- Happiness is two kinds of ice cream
- Knowing a secret

Climbing a tree

- Happiness is five different crayons
- Catching a firefly
- Setting him free...

The characters in the musical, Charlie Brown and his friends, are elementary school children (and a beagle of indeterminate age). But in giving voice to the things and experiences that make them each happy, they remind us to seek and embrace those moments of bliss, fleeting though they may be, at any opportunity we may find.

The compendium of aphorisms known as Pirke Avot quotes Rabbi Ben Zoma teaching, "*Eizehu ashir? HaSame'ach B'Chelko*—who is wise? One who is happy with the lot they have been given." In other words, we needn't wait for Purim, or for the month of Adar, to feel gleeful—we should strive to find happiness in every moment of our existence.

We are extraordinarily happy to be able to return to our beautifully re-imagined sanctuary space to celebrate Purim with one another this year. You may recall that the last time we gathered in great numbers for a festival celebration was Purim of 2020, when we enjoyed our "Annie" shpiel. Last year, we were able to produce a fun and fabulous "Little Shop of Horrors" shpiel on YouTube, but we are so excited to be able to perform this year's shpiel, based on "Hamilton," before a live audience.

The shpiel will take place on Wednesday evening, March 16 at 7:00 PM in the sanctuary. We do recognize that not everyone may be ready for public gatherings yet (or may be travelling), so there will also be an opportunity to watch the shpiel on Zoom at <u>https://us02web.zoom.us/j/85879499627</u>. We'll use a special password for the event: **Purim22**. Following the shpiel, we will have a brief Egalitarian Traditional festival evening service, and a reading of the whole megillah. GREEN TEAM TIP

You might be ramping up plans for your yard or garden this year since we have occasional warm days that lure us outside.

Consider planning a rain garden or swale to reduce run-off into our drainage system. At the same time, you can introduce some native species and a variety of pollinators to your yard.

Local garden centers have some native species but our best local source is the annual spring plant sale from Grand Prairie Friends.

This is a great way to reduce the amount of mowing in what might be a low or problematic part of your yard.

now, many of you have seen the sanctuary in person, and others on photos. It looks mostly done, and you may not see many changes over the past few weeks, but there are small steps of progress. For example, the bimah's steps were stained and some of the final wiring was put in place. However, these are minor changes and not noticeable unless you know where to look.

Other work is happening off-site, like the creation of the wood cabinets ("millwork") that will go along the east wall and the fabrication of the ark. These larger components will come to Sinai as pieces that will be assembled on site. The timelines for these are still changing, as final details get worked out and the materials become available.

A final area of progress is the formal process of inspections with the City. These are occurring for individual components (mechanical, electrical) before a final review occurs.

In short, there's progress occurring and everyone on the SRC and its sub-committees are looking forward to a grand opening celebration this Spring!
