## From Rabbí Alan Cook's Desk



A few days after our dedicatory event for the revitalized sanctuary and pods, a few of us met with representatives from Landau|Zinder, the architects who helped to design this reimagined space. At one point during the conversation, temple president Julia Rietz posed the question, "What is your favorite feature of the renovation?"

I have many favorite components, to be honest. I love that our bima has been lowered, and now has a ramp, so that service leaders and participants are closer to the congregation and no one is barred from access to the pulpit. I love the natural light that pours in through the new windows on the north and south walls of the sanctuary. I love the new screens and other audiovisual components that allow us to present liturgy in the sanctuary in new and creative ways while also conducting hybrid programs for those unable to join us in person.

But when Julia asked the question, I answered without hesitation. My favorite feature is a somewhat hidden one. You can best see it if you are seated in one of the three chairs on "stage right" of the bima. From that vantage point, if you look at the inside of the beautiful new Torah reading table designed by artist Amy Reichert, you will see this feature in the wood grain:



To me, this represents arms reached out in a gesture of blessing or embrace. To me, this is what our congregation is all about.

At our annual congregational meeting, I shared a teaching from Rabbi Charlie Cytron-Walker. Rabbi Charlie bravely endured, and escaped, a harrowing hostage situation at his congregation in Colleyville, Texas back in January. He spoke at the New York commencement ceremonies for Hebrew Union College, and remarked on a passage in the Talmud in which the rabbis debate whether a two-headed person is actually considered one person or two. He noted that the rabbis ultimately determined that if one were to pour hot water over one of the heads, and the other cried out in pain, we would understand that this was a single creature with two heads, whose pains and joys were intertwined.

Rabbi Charlie continued, saying that the same is true of the Jewish community—when one Jew is in distress in Colleyville, Texas, a Jew in New York, or Paris, or Champaign feels empathy.

On a more compact scale, we can say the same is true of Sinai Temple. We join in one another's simchas; we strive to provide one another with uplift at moments of sorrow. The image in the wood of our table will serve as a reminder to me, each time I look at it, of the embrace (literal and figurative) in which we hold one another within this congregation.

At the conclusion of each Shabbat service, I spread my fingers in the style of the *Cohanim* of old and offer a benediction. Recently, others have copied this stance; some weeks I look out and see the entire congregation with their fingers held in this manner. This brings me great joy, as we gather in sacred community, and extend our blessings to one another.

May we always do so.
