

On Tuesday, November 8, our country will hold elections. The candidates and issues being decided upon in each state will have a monumental impact on the future of our nation; I do not feel it is hyperbole to state that this is one of the most consequential elections of our lifetime.

Voter turnout is statistically depressed during so-called "midterm" elections as opposed to years in which there is a presidential contest. Nonetheless, I hope that every eligible voter will exercise their rights and ensure that their voices are heard. Civic engagement is a significant American value that is upheld in Jewish tradition, as well. Jeremiah reminds us to "seek the welfare of the city" (Jeremiah 29:7), and the book of Deuteronomy instructs us to appoint judges, magistrates, and officials who will "govern the people with due justice" (Deuteronomy 16:18). This is not an election to skip (if you're voting by mail, make sure to postmark/ drop your ballot prior to the deadline!).

I believe the privacy of one's ballot is sacrosanct; it would not be appropriate for me to endorse specific candidates or parties here. I do pray that voters will examine their personal consciences and values, and consider not only their own short-term interests, but also the well-being of their neighbors and their community.

As I spoke about on Yom Kippur morning (sermon available on the Sinai Temple website), we have an imperative as human beings and as Jews to look out for one another. If we see laws being proposed or rhetoric being spoken that threatens others' lives, liberties, and personal autonomy because of their gender, or their race, or who they love, or where they come from, or their socio-economic status, we must take action. As Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. taught, "In the end we will remember not the words of our enemies, but the silence of our friends." If we have the opportunity to exercise our vote in order to repudiate hatred and cruelty, then it is incumbent upon us to do so unequivocally.

There are ideas of liberty and freedom which have stood for more than 245 years in this country. Many of them are underscored in Jewish tradition. As these values are called into question during this month's election, let us make informed choices that will preserve these ideals for future generations.

May God bless these United States of America, and may God bless us each with courage, compassion, and insight at the ballot box, and throughout our lives.

GREEN TEAM TIP

Heading into the winter months, it's a great time to look around the household to see what can be reused or upcycled instead of being discarded. We had a shower curtain liner that was about to be thrown out and replaced, but then we realized that only the bottom edge was beyond cleaning or bleaching. Otherwise the fabric and grommets were OK.

So we cut off the bottom inch of fabric and removed the intact rubber piece enclosed in the fabric. It was easy to resew the hem, again encasing the rubber strip within the hem. We'll discard just the narrow piece of fabric and will have several more years of curtain use.
