High Holiday Food Drive

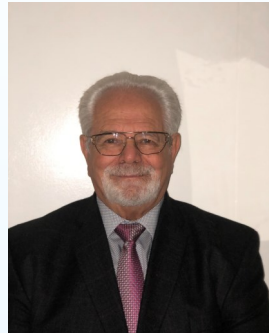


Sinai Temple is once again collecting donations during the High Holy Days to benefit the Eastern Illinois Food Bank. In recent years, we have collected

more than 400 lbs of food and more than \$6000 in donations each year to help the Food Bank to provide for those in our community facing food insecurity.

This year, the food bank has requested that we focus our donation efforts only on monetary gifts; we will NOT be accepting physical donations of food. We will provide donation envelopes at Rosh Hashanah services. Please return any donations on Yom Kippur, Sunday September 25/ Monday September 26 to the baskets in the front lobby. You may also mail your contribution directly to EIF. Please indicate in the memo line of your check that your donation is part of Sinai Temple's food drive. Thank you for your generous support of this Tikkun Olam effort. The Eastern Illinois Foodbank and its beneficiaries welcome any amount you wish to give. For example, \$150 will provide 750 meals for our neighbors in need.
