From Rabbi Alan Cook's Desk



The Torah teaches us that Moses lived to the age of one hundred and twenty. While certainly other figures in the Torah, particularly in the Book of Genesis, are said to have enjoyed

longer lifespans (Methusaleh tops them all at 969 years), it is Moses' longevity and legacy that we aspire to emulate. Many will say to friends on birthdays or other milestone occasions, "Ad me'ah v'esrim—may you live to be one hundred and twenty."

Per our anniversary publication, *Amid the Alien Corn*, our congregation was founded on February 7, 1904. This means that this month marks our 120th year as a holy community. We are blessed to have reached such a milestone; like Moses our legacy continues to resonate. Where our founders might barely have had the insight (or *chutzpah*) to say "*ad me'ah v'esrim*—until 120," we can look forward and declare, "*ad me'ah v'esrim v'hal'ah*—until 120 and beyond!" Together, we can imagine what the next century, and onward, will mean for this sacred community as we continue to grow into a true center for Jewish life here in East Central Illinois.

We've accomplished quite a bit in our first 120 years: we were instrumental in the establishment of the Hillel Foundation at UIUC, the nation's first Hillel; we provided a training ground for Sally Priesand, who would go on to become the first American woman ordained as a rabbi; we successfully transitioned from our original home on Clark Street to our new building on Windsor Road, expanded in 1999, and renovated and revitalized in 2022; we built and sustained a world-class religious school program; we fostered meaningful relationships with interfaith partners and within the broader C-U community; and so much more. Now is the time to think about what a vibrant congregation for the 21st century can aspire to be.

Rabbi Jody, the Board, and I welcome your participation in visioning what new projects and opportunities we might launch as we plan for our next 120 years. We invite your energies and enthusiasm in taking these goals from imagination to reality. And if you are so blessed as to be able to help underwrite some of our "wish list" items, we invite you to contact one of us to discuss your passions and figure out how we can bring these new ideas into fruition.

We are all so blessed to join with one another in sustaining this *kehillah kedosha*—this holy congregation.

May we continue to go from strength to strength.

From President Lil Levant

I hope you are doing well and getting through the winter with ease. Here is my February report:

The January Board of Trustees meeting focused on a presentation from CliftonLarsonAllen on financial and administrative best practices. There were no real surprises; however, their recommendations will help us implement the findings, some of which are long overdue. I am working closely with Gary Bernstein and the Board officers to develop a strategy and timetable for implementation. To give you a sense of what is in the report, for example, it outlines the need to implement policies and procedures to allow for better continuity of Temple leadership; and to better define roles and responsibilities for Board members and administrative staff. I am very excited to tackle this and other challenges to ensure those who follow us will have a defined template of best business practices.

I want to update you on membership dues. Currently, we are falling a little short on receiving pledge commitments and payments for membership dues for FY24. As you are aware, the major portion of our revenues come from membership commitments that fund everything from operations to security to staff salaries. If you have not yet fulfilled your pledge commitment, please do so as soon as possible. It is extremely important for us to know what funds are outstanding so we can make sure our budget projections are accurate. My sincere thanks to our congregants for your generosity. I am confident we will meet our membership goals with your generous commitment.

As you may be aware, a Nominating Committee will soon be appointed to select candidates to fill the FY25 Board Nominated Slate. These nominees will be presented at the May annual meeting for a vote by those members attending. Our by-laws require that the Nominating Committee consist of a total of seven members (three Board members whose terms do not expire at the next election and four members of the Congregation who are NOT members of the Board). If you are interested in serving on the Nominating Committee or on the Board of Trustees, please contact me as soon as possible.

Board and volunteer development has been a key concern going forward. In my view, we need to cultivate and assign volunteer roles to our next generation of leaders. My generation, while integral to our Temple community, needs the next generation to assume leadership roles. Obviously, the sustainability of the Temple is reliant on this progression. The energy and ideas of a younger generation of leaders will strengthen our Congregation.

One of the highlights this year has been that we were able to fill the position of Student Board Representative. Sarah Bleill, who grew up in our congregation and celebrated both her Bat Mitzvah and Confirmation here, has been serving in this important role for several months now. Although Sarah serves in an ex-officio, non-voting role, her contributions, both concrete and symbolic, have been substantial. It has been such a pleasure having her with us every month. Her unique perspective along with her energy and enthusiasm for Temple life, have been inspirational. Sarah represents a group of phenomenal Temple youth who have great passion about the Temple community. We are grateful for her leadership and engagement.

These are just some of the many things going on at Sinai that make me feel excited and honored to serve as your president.
