From Rabbi Alan Cook's Desk



In December, at the memorial service of Barbara Orden, z"l, her family honored her memory by singing Simon and Garfunkel's song, "April Come She Will." It was a fitting tribute to a dearly missed congregant,

whose musical and artistic legacy continues to reverberate in our community and our congregation.

Though I'm familiar with most of the duo's greatest hits, "April Come She Will" was lesser-known to me. Paul Simon has indicated that he wrote it in tribute to a former girlfriend and her changing moods, but I think it works more generally as a rumination on the fact that time does not stop for any person. April, and the rebirth that we experience in springtime, are part of the natural order of things and we expect its arrival in due season. At the same time, we should indeed be grateful that after the darkness and cold of the winter months, April comes "when streams are ripe and swelled with rain."

In April, we will celebrate Passover. It's perceived as being "late" this year in its position relative to our secular calendar, partially because this year we've had a leap year in the Hebrew calendar with the insertion of an additional month. But April (and Passover) come, they will.

This year, we will return to a tradition we had begun prior to COVID and celebrate an Interfaith Seder. On Sunday, April 14 (one week prior to the actual beginning of Passover), we will welcome friends and neighbors from other faith communities to join in a service and dinner that builds on the familiar Seder rubrics to express our longing for freedom for all. Drawing from a variety of faith expressions, we'll share songs and readings that celebrate what we all have in common. We hope that, as in the past, this program will allow the blossoming of friendships and continued paths toward love and understanding. This is a family-friendly event, and all are welcome, but

For us to maintain our programming, operational costs, and staffing, we are totally reliant on your generosity. In the coming months our Board of Trustees and other member volunteers will be working on new strategies in the areas of fundraising and membership engagement and development. It is my fervent hope that with a new focus on these areas along with fresh ideas, we can establish a broader funding portfolio. But until then, membership dues, optimally 2% of your household income, is what we are depending on. Please make your dues payments as soon as possible for FY24.

Please save the date of Sunday, May 19th at 11am for our important annual meeting. It is important that all members make an effort to be present – we will walk through the state of our congregation, present the FY25 Budget for your approval, and present the slate of new Board of Trustees members for your approval. We will be sending out the proposed budget and slate well in advance of the meeting, as required in our bylaws. Stay tuned in the coming weeks for more details. Each year, the Purim Greetings fundraiser seems to grow – we reach more people in so many ways. We see more people purchasing greetings for the entire Sinai Temple community, we have new people sending greetings to friends, we send more baskets, we bake more and engage more volunteers. Thank you to all who are involved – even if you think your contribution is a small one – every bit of help makes this fundraiser successful. This year, roughly 6,700 greetings were sent, 300 baskets were made up and delivered and we had about 45 volunteers. I am so proud of our community and am thrilled to share that our gross revenue this year was \$17,465 – the support of the Sinai Temple Religious School and of our community is both appreciated and awesome!

Green Team and Events

Green Team Tip

Spring cleaning before Pesach is a good time to get back to basics with our cleaning habits. You may get good results by using the old standbys that are likely on the shelf: distilled white vinegar and baking soda. Some advice includes making a solution of half vinegar and half water that can be put into a spray bottle for general cleaning. A paste of baking soda and

water can be effective for non-abrasive scrubbing, including rejuvenating non-stick pans. For adding an excellent scent, use lemon juice on surfaces that are appropriate.

Be sure to check on the safety of any homemade combinations – there are good resources for safe alternatives to the usual cleaning products.

For everyday use in the kitchen, consider reusable cloths such as the popular Swedish cloths that are more absorbent than paper towels. (You got one a couple of years ago at Purim!) A recent article in The Guardian included the estimate that using a roll of paper towels is the equivalent of more than using 5 gallons of gasoline, in terms of the product manufacturing. Earth911.com estimates that a three-pack of the Swedish dishcloths has the same carbon footprint as a roll of paper towels, so you would be helping to reduce carbon emissions if you reuse the dishcloths and just put them in with other laundry.
