From Rabbi Alan Cook's Desk



As most of you are aware, our current Jewish year, 5784, is a leap year. Because the Hebrew calendar is a lunar calendar, eleven out of every nineteen years have an added

month (a second month of Adar) in order to better sync things up with the solar calendar and ensure that holidays are observed at their seasonally appropriate time. In leap years, holidays that occur after the inserted month are “later” (at least in the Gregorian calendar; they fall in exactly the same place in the Hebrew calendar). For instance, the festival of Shavuot does not begin this year until the evening of June 11.

Shavuot is the holiday celebrating the giving of the Torah. Certainly this is an event central to our concept of Jewish peoplehood, and worthy of commemoration. But because of the holiday’s timing at the conclusion of the school year and toward the beginning of summer vacations, it does not receive as much attention as many of our other festivals. Oftentimes, we celebrate the confirmation of our oldest Religious School students on or around Shavuot, but due to the demographics of our student body, we do not have such a class this year.

At Passover, we are called upon as individuals to imagine that each of us personally participated in the Exodus experience. In a similar vein, we are taught that the crowd assembled at Sinai for the revelation of Torah included all Jews who had ever existed prior to that moment, and those who were yet to be born. Each of us has a direct personal connection to Torah.

This is underscored in our prayerbook, *Mishkan Tefillah*, which includes a meditation from Rabbi Rami Shapiro:

In each age, we receive and transmit Torah.

At each moment we are addressed by the World.

In each age we are challenged by our ancient teaching.

At each moment we stand face to face with Truth.

In each age we add our wisdom to that which has gone before.

At each moment the knowing heart is filled with wonder.

In each age the children of Torah become its builders and seek to set the world firm on a foundation of Truth.

Though the school year has ended, learning never ceases. We heed the teaching of the sage Rabbi Ben Bag Bag (yes, it’s his real name!) who said of the Torah, “Turn it and turn it again, for everything is in it.” We continue to immerse ourselves in the Torah’s important laws and traditions so that we may, as Rabbi Shapiro encourages, “add our wisdom to that which has gone before.”

Please see elsewhere in this bulletin for opportunities to observe Shavuot with our Sinai Temple community.

I wish you a joyous and happy summer, filled with meaningful learning.

From President Lil Levant

In case you missed the Annual Meeting, this is what I spoke about with the Congregation.

Our Board of Trustees' focus has been on strengthening our infrastructure in two key areas – best financial and administrative practices, and volunteerism. And we are getting there.

As you may know, several months ago, the Board of Trustees approved the hiring of the accounting firm, CliftonLarsonAllen to conduct a comprehensive analysis of the Temple's administrative and business practices. Thanks to the diligent efforts of Shari Fox and Gary Bernstein, we have begun to implement new and improved best business practices, as recommended by CLA. This has been a particularly important exercise because it has been a while since we eliminated the bookkeeping position (out of budget necessity) and because of staff turnover.

In another key area, our Security Committee has accomplished a lot. As you know, immediately following October 7th, we hired a core team of five off-duty and retired police officers as Security to enhance safety during most Temple events and services. Our sincere appreciation goes to Art Siegel and Julia Rietz for facilitating this. I'm pleased to report that this is working quite well.

At the meeting, the congregation overwhelmingly passed a motion to increase the security fee from \$72 to \$120 annually.

Recently the Board of Trustees has turned its attention to membership engagement and fundraising. Under Amy Roady's leadership we are in the process of building new membership engagement programs. Also, in the coming weeks, we hope to begin on a fundraising strategy. Clearly, we need to bolster membership dues with additional income sources by building a fundraising initiative. We look forward to reporting on these efforts in future monthly bulletins. (And please, PLEASE read your weekly e-newsletter and monthly bulletin.)

With all this, we are moving in a positive direction, but we do have challenges in two specific areas: financial and volunteerism.

The costs associated with maintaining Sinai Temple continue to rise. Our operating costs – heat, electricity, general upkeep of our space, building maintenance, office supplies, all these costs continue to go up. The reality we face extends beyond merely sustaining our operations. We anticipate that security expenses will double this year.

We need EVERY ONE of our members to give to their capacity – at least 2% of their annual household income. If we were to achieve this 2% rate from all our members, we would be able to invest and grow our Temple programmatically. So, when you fill out your pledge form, please simply take out a calculator to figure out your 2%. Frankly, this year's shortfall is due in part to some congregants not fully participating financially. So please pay your fair share and advocate for others to pay their fair share, too.

In the next couple of weeks, you will receive the FY25 pledge forms. As soon as the form becomes available, I ask that you complete it. If you are unsure of what your annual membership contribution will be, it is still imperative that you give us a range or an idea in writing, on the pledge form. Without these completed forms from every congregant, we are unable to budget effectively, thus jeopardizing our financial health.

The challenge of running our congregation with a small staff requires volunteer efforts from our members. Here are some examples of what we need: occasional office help including answering phones, helping with mailings and other administrative stuff, hosting a Friday night Oneg, fundraising, membership engagement, marketing and publicity. The list goes on and on.

Please contact me if you can spare a few hours once in a while to volunteer.

I believe, along with the Board of Trustees and staff, that Sinai Temple's future can be remarkable. We can easily build on what we have created if we truly work together. We aspire not to merely tread water but to grow, evolve, and flourish as a congregation. Stagnation is incompatible to our vision for the future. We envision a vibrant, full-service Center of Jewish Life for Champaign-Urbana and our surrounding communities.

In the spirit of solidarity and shared purpose, I invite you to join me in answering this call to action in two ways: by fulfilling your financial obligation as a Sinai Temple member and by volunteering your time. Together, let us pave the way for a future filled with hope, growth, and blessings.

Appliances such as gas stoves have emissions that can adversely impact health, with increased risks in situations without adequate ventilation.
