# From Rabbi Alan Cook's Desk



The rabbis teach, "mishenichnas Adar, marbim b'simcha—when the month of Adar begins, our joy increases." Most of us could certainly use some increased joy as life presents challenges and worries. We look forward to our Purim celebrations (see elsewhere in this bulletin for full details) as a fun means of marking this special month, and basking in the joy of community.

Another phrase that we hear in connection with Purim is "v'nahafoch hu—and it was turned upside down. (Esther 9:1)". In the context of the megillah, it reminds us that although Haman sought to do evil, his nefarious plan was turned upside down and good prevailed. In a similar sense, we are reminded that we have the power to determine our destiny. If we are unhappy with the way things are

unfolding—be it in our own lives or in the world at large, we have the opportunity to turn things on their head, so to speak, and to take steps toward positive change.

Which brings us to a third important phrase associated with Adar and with the festival of Purim. In Esther 4:14, Mordecai comes to Esther to tell her of Haman's cruel intentions. He notes that as queen, she is perfectly positioned to intercede with Ahashuerus on behalf of the Jewish people. "Mi yodea im l'eit kazot higa'at l'malchut—who knows if it was for a time such as this that you were made queen?" he asks.

Each of us is here for a purpose. Each of us can make a difference in the world. Each of us can create light and joy and laughter, even when the world seems to have a preponderance of darkness and despair. This is our moment. May we each come to appreciate the pleasure of the month of Adar by working in our own ways to share gladness with others and bring our world one step closer to peace and wholeness.

# From President Lil Levant

As I have written in the past, we need to focus on building our financial infrastructure to support and sustain Sinai Temple as a Center for Jewish life in Champaign-Urbana.

I understand the critical importance of maintaining a strong financial foundation to ensure the long-term sustainability and growth of our community. While our spiritual mission remains central, the practical reality is that synagogues, like any organization, require adequate, multi-tiered resources to function and thrive. This is why I believe it's crucial for our congregation to focus not only on membership as our primary source of income, but to develop additional initiatives to support our collective goals.

Additional fundraising initiatives are essential for generating the funds needed to augment membership dues to support staffing and programming, maintain our building, and expand our outreach. Organizing regular fundraising events and campaigns as part of a strategy would help meet our immediate needs and strengthen our sense of community. Furthermore, these events create opportunities for congregants to come together, share in the joy of giving, and contribute to causes that impact us all.

Planned giving is another vital component. Encouraging members to consider long-term contributions through bequests or endowments ensures that future generations will benefit from the same vibrant, meaningful community we enjoy today. This form of giving would allow our congregation to build a financial legacy that will provide for ongoing staffing, programming, and maintenance needs.

Under the leadership of Rabbi Alan and Rabbi Jody, we have significantly increased the pace of a wide range of activities and events. Many of our members have responded well to these opportunities and are actively involved. My hope is that when our members feel more connected to our Temple's mission, they are more likely to contribute both time and resources. By fostering a spirit of collaboration and shared responsibility, we can build a solid foundation for the future of our congregation.

Developing and formalizing a fundraising strategy to include these and other initiatives is critical. In the coming months, it is my hope to gather a group of members to work on this strategy and help lead the charge.
